Remote Learning Contingency Plan

In developing our remote learning contingency plan, we have been mindful of the following principles:

- Resources and teaching videos reflect each department's curriculum expectations.
- Staff have been trained in the use of remote learning platforms and strategies.
- Pupils who do not have suitable online access will be provided with printed resources.
- We will work with families of younger pupils and some pupils with SEND who may not be able to access remote education without adult support in order to deliver a broad and ambitious curriculum.

When teaching pupils remotely:

- 1. Assignments will be set so that pupils have meaningful and ambitious work each day in a number of different subjects.
- 2. Teachers will deliver a planned and well-sequenced curriculum so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with a good level of clarity about what is intended to be taught and practised in each subject.
- 3. Frequent, clear explanations of new content, delivered by a teacher in the school or through high-quality curriculum resources or videos, will be provided.
- 4. Teachers will check work regularly in order to gauge how well pupils are progressing. The frequency of feedback will vary dependent upon the amount curriculum time allocated to each subject.
- 5. Teachers will adjust the pace or difficulty of what is being taught in response to questions or assessments, including, where necessary, revising material or simplifying explanations to ensure pupils' understanding.
- 6. Programmes of learning will be set which are of equivalent length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school, ideally including at least one daily contact from a teacher.

Pupil Isolation

Scenario 1: Individual students self-isolating

Minimum expectations:

- Slideshows with worksheets/task uploaded onto google classroom with instructions from teacher for all lessons
- Teacher to organise the current work on google classroom and archive any former learning
- Students to be shown how to access this in a lesson.

Additional support that may be offered to pupils:

- Instructional videos used to support pupils learning/compliment the slideshow
- 'Live' lessons broadcast to pupils at scheduled time of lesson using Google Meet

Scenario 2: Partial Year group sent home/Not full class

Minimum expectations:

- Slideshows with worksheets/task uploaded onto google classroom with instructions from teacher for all lessons
- Teacher to organise the current work on google classroom and archive any former learning
- Students to be shown how to access this in a lesson
- Instructional videos used to support pupils learning/compliment the slideshow

Additional support that may be offered to pupils:

- 'Live' lessons broadcast to pupils at scheduled time of lesson using Google Meet
- Merge classes where numbers/classrooms allow for social distancing to be maintained between groups. This would free up another member of staff to deliver a 'live' lesson via Google Meet

Scenario 3: Partial Year group sent home/Full class absent

Minimum expectations:

- Slideshows with worksheets/task uploaded onto google classroom with instructions from teacher for all lessons
- Teacher to organise the current work on google classroom and archive any former learning
- Students to be shown how to access this in a lesson
- Instructional videos used to support pupils learning/compliment the slideshow
- 50% of lessons to be delivered 'Live' broadcast to pupils at scheduled time of lesson using Google Meet

Additional support that may be offered to pupils:

 Staff to be available during scheduled lesson time for pupils to ask questions/receive feedback regarding uploaded resources

Scenario 4: Full Year group isolating:

Minimum expectations:

- Slideshows with worksheets/task uploaded onto google classroom with instructions from teacher for all lessons
- Teacher to organise the current work on google classroom and archive any former learning
- Students to be shown how to access this in a lesson
- Instructional videos used to support pupils learning/compliment the slideshow
- 50% of lessons to be delivered 'Live' broadcast to pupils at scheduled time of lesson using Google Meet
- Staff to be available during scheduled lesson time for pupils to ask questions/receive feedback regarding uploaded resources
